SHINING STAR story of the month: Navy sail in for Top End Indigenous Challenge

On 15 July 2010 a representative women's AFL team from the Royal Australian Navy paid a visit to the community of Bathurst on the Tiwi Islands. Karina Gray, from Starwin Management spent two days with the Tiwi women supporting them to prepare and take part in the Top End Indigenous Challenge and had a few kicks and a great time in the process – seeing women 'make their mark'!

ABC Darwin followed the event with an online feature at: www.abc.net.au/sport. An excerpt from the story:

Using the engagement tool of AFL which is always popular with Territorians the Navy worked with both the Tiwi Islands and the community of Oenpelli to put on two showcase events.

On Wednesday 15 July 2010 Navy women from all over Australia formed a Royal Australia Navy AFL women's representative side and as a team sailed over to the Tiwi Islands to take on a Tiwi Islands women's football team, captained by Loretta Cook of Melville Island.

In a exhibition game, the first of it's kind to be held in the Top End, the Tiwi community got right behind the game to cheer on the Tiwi girls who put on a fantastic display of skill to impress the Navy women in their 8.6(52) to 6.8(42) win.

All Australian player Natasha Puautjimi led the way for Tiwi with a dominant performance earning her the respect of the Navy women and a medallion as reward for effort.

A five hour sail home on an Army barge couldn't dampen the spirits as the Navy women were treated to a stunning dry season sunset to cap off the day.

The Navy furthered their reach out to communities yesterday when a Navy men's team had the opportunity to play a curtain-raiser game against a side from Oenpelli prior to the Bulldogs 36 win over Port at Marrara stadium. The Navy men were convincing victors 28.12(180) to Oenpelli's 6.2(38).
